As a convenience for our tenants, we offer ACH, as a way of automatically paying each month's rent. ACH stands for Automated Clearing House. It is an electronic network for financial transactions in the US.

You can pick up the form in the main office. Fill out the form and attach a voided check. Return the form and check to either front desk, Lodge or Manor. The rent will be deducted from your bank account automatically each month.

If you sign up in the month of October, your name will be put into a drawing for a \$50 gift card to Target.

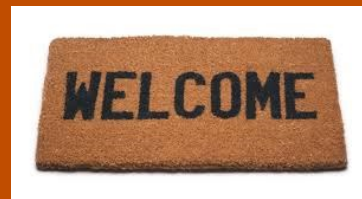

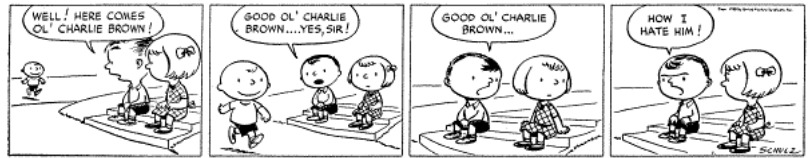
Residents enjoyed bible study with Pastor Jan. Our Artsy Smartsy class created fall paper leaves.

## Did you know...Charles M. Schulz

On October 2, 1950 the nation was introduced to a loveable new character, Charlie Brown. Minnesota native, Charles M. Schulz published the first Peanuts comic strip in 7 newspapers nationwide. Along with Charlie Brown, he brought to life many iconic characters: Snoopy, Linus, Sally, Lucy, Peppermint Patty and many more.



Even though Charles Schulz was the creator of the Peanuts Gang, he never liked the name of the comic. Charles wanted to name it "Good Old Charlie Brown". Many of the characters in the Peanuts comic were based off of real life people or events. For instance, Charlie Brown's name came from an old friend of Charles Schulz who he had met after serving in the Second World War. Charlie Brown's infamous crush, the little red-haired girl was based off a girl Charles Schulz had once loved. Schulz introduced his first African-American character, Franklin, after the assassination of Martin Luther King Jr. The 1969 music festival, Woodstock, gave Schulz the name for Snoopy's yellow feathered friend.

The Peanuts Gang even made it to space. NASA got in touch with Schulz after the Apollo 1 fire disaster. NASA wanted to create a new safety program and requested the mascot for the campaign be Snoopy. Schulz agreed to the partnership. Later, on the Apollo 10 mission, the crew named the lunar module, Snoopy. The command module was named Charlie Brown.

Schulz continued to draw and write Peanuts comics for nearly 50 years. In 1999, Schulz announced his retirement. On February 12, 2000 Charles M. Schulz lost his battle with colon cancer. His death was just one day shy of the final Peanuts comic strip appearance in the newspaper, February 13<sup>th</sup>.
